Building Partnerships – checklist 2

Introduction:

This check list may help you develop the building blocks of partnership between your organisation and flood risk communities. Partnerships come in all shapes and sizes, but the issues that affect them are often the same or very similar.

The questions relate to the engaging <u>communities partnership working information</u> <u>note</u> and are based on the following stages.

Does the partnership need a vision or mission statement?
